He got an estimate from a Ramp Company for around \$9,000.00. The Department of Maine can come up with \$2.000.00 thru the (VEFAP), Veterans Emergency Financial Assistance Program. However that leaves us \$7,000.00 short. Mike estimated that the material could be purchased for less than the \$2,000.00, even with the price of material what it is today.
